



The castle - town-hall

The royal "new castle" from the 11th century was transformed into a mini "Versailles" in the 17th and 18th centuries. The Duke de Penthièvre, grandson of Louis XIV, the "Sun King", had a hand in this transformation.

A large part of the castle was destroyed after the French Revolution but the rotunda, with its remarkable dome, still survives and now houses the town hall. In the entrance hall, painted decors and a theatrical forged iron stairway from the 19th century can still be seen.

The town hall is open from Monday to Friday.






Unusual religious buildings

• The chapel "Notre-Dame de l'Épinoy" is possibly the oldest sanctuary in Châteauneuf and it is associated with the legend of the "Good Lady". A recent restoration project revealed a few secrets!

To visit the chapel, inquire at the **Tourist Information Office.**

• The church of Saint Martial, the building has a striking lowered porch tower and inside, the marble tomb of a local dignitary associated with the castle, the Marquis de La Vrillière, a remarkable example of Classical Italian funerary art.



A dynamic market town

The town possesses two interesting market halls:



- "La halle Saint Pierre", a former boat house which was transported up from the edge of the Loire (market of local produce held on a Saturday once a month).
- The "Nouvelle Halle", in the famous 19th century "Baltard" style (weekly market held here on Fridays).

The castle park and gardens

Situated in the heart of the town, around the castle, are the English-style landscaped gardens (which replaced the original French-style ones). They cover several hectares with remarkable 200 year-old tree specimens and alleys of magnolias and giant rhododendrons (flowering end of May). You can walk to the "Love Temple" and the "Sailor's Gate" leading out to the Loire, going through a newly restored wetland area with remarkable biodiversity.

Free entry until dusk.
