FORTIF

Until the 19th century, the town of Jargeau was surrounded by ramparts and moats. In 1833, a cadastral map showed that 5 towers and 3 gates still existed; the moats were no longer filled with water.














1/ La Chanterie

A bourgeois house dating from the the 20th century, in a variety of architectural styles, built on the site of the former home of the "Chantres", the mass singers. It now houses the Intercommunal Tourist Office and the Maison de Loire du Loiret. www.maisondeloire45.fr

2/ The Halle

It was built in 1884 on the site of the former Hôtel-Dieu. This complex of buildings stretched between the church and the chapel house, now the Chanterie. It was a hospital and a hospice. Today, the market is held under the covered market every Wednesday afternoon.

3/ The Collégiale Saint-Étienne

Romanesque church, built in the 12th century and consecrated by Manassès de Garlande, bishop of Orléans. The wrought iron and embossed metal pulpit, dating from 1752, is a protected historical monument.

4/ The Oscar Roty Museum

This museum retraces the life of the engraver of "La Semeuse", and is housed in the former episcopal palace, the bishop's residence and symbol of his power, hence the particularly monumental character of the building.

5/ Jeanne d'Arc

This statue of Jeanne d'Arc was created by Alfred Lanson in 1898. It depicts her holding her hand to her temple, in memory of the wound she received during the assault of 12 June 1429 on the boulevard de la Porte Madeleine.

6/ The "Laisses de crues".

At several points in the city, they mark the maximum level reached by the Loire during the floods of the 19th century.

7/ The port

Traditional boats reappeared on the Loire in the 1990s, such as the rowing boat "Rémi des Rauches", built to commemorate the centenary of the birth of Maurice Genevoix.

8/ The Belvédère

Just downstream from the present bridge, you can see the medieval stone bridge, which was successively replaced by a ferry and then by 2 suspension bridges. The current bridge dates from 1988.

9/ The Belvédère

At the belvedere, you'll find the Val de Loire weathervane - a Unesco World Heritage Site - a symbol of this sense of belonging. Weathervanes take their name from the weathervanes on the masts of traditional Loire River boats. The fanio evoking the commune represents Joan of Arc.

"Le coin menteux" (the lying corner); this was the meeting place for telling "lies". Ideally located opposite the bridge toll booth, it was a great place to observe the comings and goings of the Gergoliens.

10/ Tellement Loire Exhibition

This permanent exhibition on the Cordon wall raises public awareness of the importance of preserving the Loire's natural and cultural heritage. Dykes, birds, fishing, flora and the impact of pollution are explained to walkers and cyclists who use this route.



Walk along this impressive flood protection wall and enjoy a pleasant stroll along the river. At the end of the Loire Cordon, you will find the former house of the Loire river guard, who was in charge of maintenance and stored the cofferdams used to close the passages during floods. This is the house of the Cordon.

12/ The Porte Madeleine

It was here that Jeanne d'Arc was wounded during the assault to liberate the city from the English. This gate was opened in the city walls in the 17th century.

13/ Rue du Puits de Grenon

Admire the medallions on the facade of the 17th century house attributed to the architect Adam (between numbers 4 and 8).



14/ La Grande Rue

This typical and cosy shopping street invites you to stroll, shop or enjoy a gastronomic

15/ The artistic garden

Only visible from the street, this private property dates from 1845. The garden features several contemporary statues, some inspired by mythology, others by Arab art. At the top of the keep is Dunois, the faithful companion of Jeanne d'Arc.

16/ The former internment camp

During the Second World War, an internment camp existed on the site of the present-day "Collège Le Clos Ferbois", located 3 rue Serin-Moulin. Most of the camp's inhabitants were gypsy nomadic families and marginalised
